

Transform Work UK Statement of Faith

- A. The Full doctrinal 'Statement of Faith' to which all Transform Work UK Directors, Trustees and Staff* must subscribe articulates the long-held orthodox truths of Christianity, namely:
 - 1. The unity of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit in the Godhead.
 - 2. The sovereignty of God in creation, providence, revelation, redemption and final judgement.
 - 3. The divine inspiration and entire trustworthiness of Holy Scripture and its supreme authority in all matters of faith and conduct.
 - 4. The sinfulness and guilt of all people since the Fall, rendering them subject to God's wrath and condemnation.
 - 5. The incarnation of God's eternal Son, the Lord Jesus Christ—born of the Virgin Mary; truly divine and truly human, yet without sin.
 - 6. Redemption from the guilt, penalty and power of sin solely through the sacrificial death as our representative and substitute, of the Lord Jesus Christ, the incarnate Son of God.
 - 7. The bodily resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, and His ascension to the right hand of God the Father
 - 8. The justification of the sinner by the grace of God through faith in Christ alone.
 - 9. The necessity of the work of the Holy Spirit to make the death of Christ effective to the individual sinner, granting repentance towards God and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.
 - 10. The indwelling and work of the Holy Spirit in the believer
 - 11. The one holy, universal Church which is the Body of Christ, and to which all true believers belong.
 - 12. The expectation of the personal return of the Lord Jesus Christ.
- B. Transform Work UK will work co-operatively with a variety of other individuals and organisations (whether Christian or non-Christian) provided that this:
 - 1. does not bring dishonour to God
 - 2. does not undermine the credibility, mission and purpose of the Christian church
 - 3. advances the charitable aims of Transform Work UK, and
 - 4. does not damage the reputation or compromises the ability of Transform Work UK to fulfil its core functions
